

Ellmauer Halt Kopftörlgrat

The Ellmauer Halt (2344 m) was first climbed in 1869 by Karl Hofmann and Johann Schlechter. At the time, it was not considered the highest peak in the Wilder Kaiser. It was believed that Ackerlspitze and Treffauer were higher. The first solo ascent of the Kopftörl Ridge was made by Georg Leuchs in 1900.

Difficulty:

UIAA 4-

Effort:

1400hm, 5km to the summit, incl. approx. 300hm ascent and 1400m ridge climbing

Appreciation:

One of the most beautiful ridge climbs to the highest summit of the Wilder Kaiser, set in a charismatic alpine backdrop. Every climbing enthusiast should lay hands on this historic piece of rock at least once.

Tour Description

From the Wochenbrunner Alm, we hike through picturesque alpine meadows up to the Grutten Hut. From there, we continue to the Kopftörl, where the ridge begins.

The first section of the ridge consists of gentle terrain leading to the first tower. From here, the climbing begins — across a total of six towers — all the way to the summit.

The descent follows the Gamsängersteig trail back to the Grutten Hut and then returns to the parking area along the familiar route.
